

Points to Ponder:

Superhero movies are still popular & probably always will be. Because our world needs heroes. Our world needs leaders. Our world needs good & faithful shepherds to take care of us and to lead us. We have all probably heard that sheep are not very smart animals, but that turns out not to be true. Sheep supporters claim that this is a rumour started by cattle ranchers, because sheep don't behave like cows. Cows are herded from the rear by cowboys. They yell & prod the cows to get the going in the right direction. But when you stand behind sheep & make noises, they just try to get behind you again. So some cattle ranchers assumed that they were stupid animals. When, in fact, sheep simply prefer to be led. Cows can be pushed. Sheep must be led. And when you think about it that is really not that stupid. Sheep trust their shepherd to go where the shepherd goes. And they let the shepherd go first, to make sure the way is safe, and then invite them to follow him. And isn't that what Jesus is asking of us? He is not going to push us. He is not going to force us. Instead, Jesus just keeps calling us, in many & various ways. Inviting us over and over to follow him. He promises to lead us, to protect us, and even to lay down his life for us. And he invites us to trust him. Trust him and follow him.
