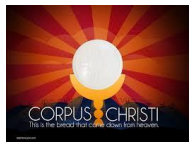

POINTS TO PONDER:

When someone we love leaves us, it's natural for us to not want to see them go, but if we really love them, we have to let them go. Real love allows us to release those we care about. When we try to hang on to the ones we love, we are being selfish. Jesus was preparing to die and eventually return to his Father, but the disciples did not want him to leave. He urged them to rejoice because he was leaving. His departure would allow the disciples and all believers to do great things, including growing Christianity. Jesus was more concerned for the disciples than he was for himself. He reassured them that they would not be alone. He promised them peace and hope-the same peace and hope he offers to all believers. There are times when we feel alone and we don't know what will happen to us. We could be stranded in a strange town with a broken-down car. Our spouse has just died and our future looks bleak. You've lost your job and you have no idea what to do next. At times like these it's natural for us to ask ourselves, 'What's to become of me?' How do we take care of ourselves in such moments?
